

We have not made final decisions on First Communion and await direction from the Diocese on public health changes.




We are actively engaged in preparations for a full catechism program in the fall of 2021. We plan to focus on family catechesis which will change the program format for some areas of the parish.

The news of the discovery of the unnamed graves of 215 children on the site of the former Kamloops Residential School continues to weigh heavy on the hearts and minds of people across our country. Locally, it strikes close to home because of our diocese's involvement with the Shubenacadie Residential School.



Parishioners are encouraged to visit the memorial set up at the St. Bernard's Park gazebo in honour of the 215 children whose remains were discovered at the former Kamloops Indian residential School.

#### From the Arch Diocese:

On Sunday, June 6 Archbishop Dunn offered the 10:30am Mass at Saint Mary's Cathedral Basilica for the repose of the souls of the 215 children found in Kamloops. During his homily he shared his reflections on residential schools and offered his apology and support to our Mi'kmag brothers and sisters. He spoke of what our Church has done in the recent past as well as what he hopes we can continue to do moving forward. 
May they be surrounded with healing and strength. May they feel solidarity and support.

We pray for our leaders at every level. May they be guided by wisdom and humility. May they use their voices and their power to build systems that uphold safety, dignity, and respect for all.

Finally, we pray for ourselves, that our hearts and our minds remain open to understanding our responsibilities toward living into Peace and Friendship, knowing we are all still Treaty people.

## **Q&A** with Father Michael



Here is a situation I have been asked many times by parishioners:

"I went to a funeral mass for a dear friend on Saturday morning and received communion. Then I went to the Saturday evening mass and received communion. My friend told me I can only receive communion once a day. How many times a day may I receive communion?"

#### Dear Parishioner:

Canon 917 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law states: "A person who has received the Most Holy Eucharist may receive it a second time on the same day only during the celebration of the Eucharist in which the person participates, with due regard for the prescription of Canon 921, 2." Canon 921, 2 states, "Even if they have received Communion in the same day, those who are in danger of death are strongly urged to receive again." The short answer is a person may receive a second time in one day at Mass, a third time (viaticum) if they are in danger of death.

Please note the canon states the second time receiving communion should be at Mass. The person must participate in the whole mass to receive communion. The wisdom of the Church is that the reception of communion should never be isolated from the rest of the Mass. To separate the sacrifice of Jesus from the reception of communion would be separating us from experiencing the love of God for us revealed in the sacrifice of the Mass.


There are two other considerations regarding the reception of Holy Communion:

- 1) The 1983 Code of Canon Law c. 916 states: "A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible." Please note the canonical requirement regarding reception of the Eucharist in this canon pertains to grave, not venial sin.
- 2) The 1983 Code states in Can. 919 §1. "A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine." Please note the fast period before receiving Holy Communion is reduced by law to approximately 15 minutes for those who are sick at home or at a hospital, those elderly confined to home or a nursing home and those who care for these people and who are unable conveniently to observe the fast.

The Church in her prudence provides these laws to help us have a balanced spiritual life, avoiding extremes that could lead us away from experiencing the Lord's love.
